There is no direct link between actual savings from workforce reductions and actual expenditures from the Trust Fund. In general, savings from these reductions are difficult to calculate, and most agencies do not do so. Though some savings would be expected from large workforce reductions, according to OMB any savings estimated to result from reductions would be used by agencies to meet their overall discretionary spending caps.
